Queen Elizabeth II's Passing - First Anniversary

The Queen, who died peacefully at Balmoral Castle at age 96 on Sept. 8, 2022 was Britain's longest-reigning monarch, having become queen at the age of 25 in 1952 following the death of her father, King George VI.

King Charles and Camilla attended private prayers to mark the anniversary of the late Queen Elizabeth II's death in a day of low-key commemorations by members of the royal family.

They were joined by the late queen's niece and nephew, Lady Sarah Chatto and the Earl of Snowdon, the children of her sister, Princess Margaret.

The Rev Kenneth Mackenzie, the minister of Crathie Kirk, who officiated at the event, said: *“It was a simple reflective time, a time where we were able to give thanks for the life of the late queen and recognise the poignancy of this day for that family and this community, as well as the nation and Commonwealth.”*

The Prince and Princess of Wales, who are in west Wales, commemorated the late queen at a 10-minute private service in the cloisters at St Davids Cathedral, Pembrokeshire, along with clergy, the choir and 20 invited guests. The couple laid a bouquet of white flowers including ivy, eucalyptus, white roses and waxflowers beside a portrait of the late queen.

The Duke of Sussex was seen leaving St George's Chapel, Windsor, where his grandmother was laid to rest next to Prince Philip, having paid a private visit there on Friday morning. Other members of the royal family are also believed to have visited the chapel privately and separately.

Earlier, William and Kate posted a personal message on social media saying: *“Today we remember the extraordinary life and legacy of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth. We all miss you. W & C.”* It was accompanied by a family photo of the late monarch surrounded by her great-grandchildren, including Prince George, Princess Charlotte and Prince Louis and her two youngest grandchildren.

A 62-gun salute was fired at the Tower of London to mark the anniversary of the king's accession, and there were also gun salutes at Hyde Park, Edinburgh Castle and Hillsborough Castle. Bells were rung at Westminster Abbey to mark the king's accession.

Hope you had fun and we look forward to doing it all again next year.

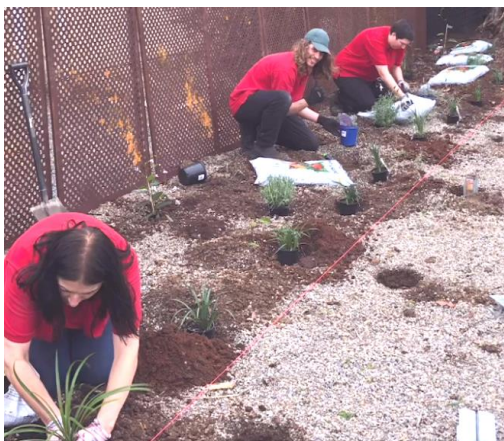


Sub-Branch Garden Gets a Make-Over

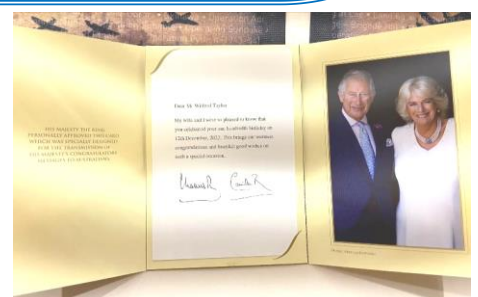

Our Sub-Branch volunteers will once again out and about this year selling Remembrance Day badges, pens, poppies and key rings.

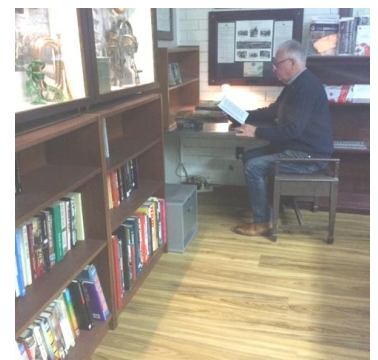

November Monthly Meeting

Members should be aware that we will conduct the November Monthly meeting on: Monday 6th November 2023 commencing at 7pm. Following this meeting we will conduct the AGM on:

Monday November 6th 2023, commencing at 7:30 p.m.

At this meeting, nominations will be called from those members who wish to be elected to one of the offices on the Sub-Branch Management Committee at the December Annual General Meeting. The offices are President, two Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, six Committee Members plus a representative endorsed by the Women's Auxiliary Committee. Nomination forms for election to office are available from the Secretary.

If more than the required number of nominations are received for any position, an election will be required, otherwise the nominee(s) will be declared "Elected". If sufficient nominations have been received prior to the "Close of Nominations", other nominations will NOT be called for at the AGM.

Remember, any financial member who qualifies for a position is able to nominate. Qualifications, as set out in the following extracts from the Model Rules for Sub-Branches (our Constitution), are included for the information of members.

Nominations by Members for the Sub-Branch Committee:

Qualifications for Office:

President/Vice-Presidents Rule 22.3 – "Any Service or Life Member shall be eligible for election as President or Vice-President of the Sub-Branch, provided that the member has been a Service or Life Member of the Sub-Branch for not less than 12 months immediately prior to the calling of nominations and has previously served at least 12 months on the Committee of a Sub-Branch.

Secretary/Treasurer/Committee Member Rule 22.4 – Any Service, Life Member or Affiliate of the Sub-Branch shall be eligible for election as Secretary, Treasurer, or as a member of the Management Committee provided that member has been a Service, Life Member or Affiliate of the Sub-Branch for not less than 12 months immediately prior to the calling of nominations."

Voting rights for Affiliates in relation to the Sub-Branch Committee:

By-Law No. 3 10.1(a) of the RSL (SA Branch) Inc. By-Laws for Sub-Branches states, in part, that Affiliates "May vote and be elected to the positions of Secretary, Treasurer or Committeeman but may not vote or be elected to the positions of President or Vice-President."

Nominations by Members to Carry out Additional Duties:

Nominations by members for appointment to carry out additional duties will also be called at the November General Meeting in the same manner as nominations for election to office as mentioned above. If you feel that you have something to offer, please consider nominating. Additional duties include - Public Officer, Membership Officer, Hall Hire Officer, Welfare Officer, Pensions Officer, Bar Manager, Assistant Bar Manager, AV and IT Officer, Publications Officer and Social Media Officer.

The above list does not preclude others who wish to contribute in some way as there are a number of other jobs that require willing hands and minds.

Nominations for office and for members to carry out additional duties will close on:

Friday October 27th 2023 at 7pm.

All positions will be declared vacant at the Annual General Meeting.

Those who are financial and have been duly nominated and seconded, in accordance with the Constitution, will be subject to the ballot process as described above.
